The Graduate School One Health Emerging Infectious Diseases 1H-EID launched in 2023 a transdisciplinary educational program on challenges raised by Emerging Infectious Diseases.

Committed to its goal of preparing the greatest number for the realities ahead, 1H-EID started in October 2025 a series of webinars, presenting each year subjects of global importance, proposed by researchers based in France and around the world.

The second theme of this 2025-2026 edition is "**Social Sciences Perspectives on One Health and Emerging Infectious Diseases**" chaired by Jules VILLA.

The general objective of the entire webinar series is to raise awareness and to identify the emergence of infections, understanding, at the same time, the causes of their evolution, the modification of pathogen agents, the change of hosts, vectors, pathogenicity, or strains; as well as collective levers for action at local, regional, national, and international levels.

Target audience: Master's and PhD students, biomedical and social science researchers, clinicians, practitioners and professionals from health, veterinary or pharmaceutical fields.

The theme **"Social Sciences Perspectives on One Health and Emerging Infectious Diseases"** presents some of the latest projects, trends, and areas directly connected to One Health and Emerging Infectious Diseases; shedding light on the methodological and epistemological specificities of social science research: the kind of work conducted by social scientists, the questions raised by emerging infectious diseases, the variety of case studies from diverse geographical, social and cultural contexts, the critical reflections on the ethical, political, and social dimensions associated with emerging infectious diseases; as well as the interdisciplinary dialogue between biomedical, ecological, and social science researchers to enlarge a network and encourage cross-disciplinary literacy and collaborations.
